

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■ In 1891, medicine became the first profession licensed by the New York
State Board of Regents.
New York's unique system
of professional regulation,
recognized as a model for public protection, has grown to encompass over 900,000 practitioners and over 30,000 professional practice business entities in more 54 professions.

- Public Protection
- the authorization to practice and use a professional title
- Your license is valid for life unless it is revoked, annulled, or suspended by the Board of Regents.



- Not a "right"
- Not just a pre-requisite for a job
- It is a Responsibility –
- With a professional license, you are entrusted by the State of New York with practicing a profession that could cause harm to the public



- Licensees are responsible to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the public.
- Licensees are responsible to ensure that they are competent to provide the tests and procedures they are requested to perform



- Licensees must adhere to the Rules of the Board of Regents on Unprofessional Conduct and the State Law on Professional Misconduct.
- Licensees are responsible health care practitioners.



§6630(3). Definition of practice of Perfusion (1)

The term "perfusion" means the provision of extracorporeal or intracorporeal patient care services to support or replace the circulatory or respiratory function of a patient, including the administration of pharmacological and therapeutic agents, and blood products, and the management, treatment and monitoring of the physiological status of a patient during the operation of extracorporeal circulation equipment or intracorporeal equipment that replaces or support circulatory or respiratory functions.

§6630(3). Definition of practice of Perfusion (2)

All perfusion services shall be pursuant to the order and direction of a physician. Perfusion services may be performed in a general hospital licensed pursuant to article twenty-eight of the public health law or during the transport of patients or organs supported by extracorporeal or intracorporeal equipment.

Perfusionist License Requirements (1)

- Application
- Education:
 - baccalaureate or higher degree in perfusion, or
 - baccalaureate or higher degree and a credit bearing certificate program in perfusion, or
 - until 10-21-18 completion of a baccalaureate or higher degree and an accredited training program in perfusion (non-credit bearing)



Perfusionist License Requirements 2

- Examination: ABCP Certification Exam
- be of good moral character
- 21 years of age
- Fees
 - \$50 license fee
 - \$150 triennial registration fee



Limited permits

- An applicant for a limited permit to practice as a licensed perfusionist shall:
- file an application with the department on a form prescribed by the department together with a fee of \$105 for the limited permit;
- meet all the requirements for licensure as a licensed perfusionist, except the examination requirement; and
- practice as a perfusionist only under the supervision of a licensed perfusionist and pursuant to the order and direction of a physician.
- 5. The limited permit in perfusion shall be valid for a period of not more than 12 months, provided that a limited permit may be extended for an additional 12 months at the discretion of the department for good cause as determined by the department. The time authorized by such limited permit and subsequent extension shall not exceed 24 months in total

Grandparenting

- An individual who meets the requirements for a license as a licensed perfusionist except for examination, experience and education and who meets the requirements enumerated under paragraphs (1) or (2) of this subdivision may be licensed without meeting additional requirements provided that such individual submits an application to the department on or before October 20, 2018:
- 1) applicants may be licensed if they have been practicing as a perfusionist, for five years in the past ten years in an inpatient unit that provides cardiac surgery services in a hospital. At least three of such years of experience shall have occurred during the past five years; or
- applicants who possess certification from a national certification organization acceptable to the State Committee for Perfusion and the department may be licensed if they have been employed as a perfusionist, for three of the past five years.

New York's **Professional Misconduct**Enforcement System



 - Step 1: The Investigation
 - Step 2: Board Screening
 - Step 3: Hearing
 - Step 4: Board of Regents Determination
 - Step 5: Publicizing Disciplinary Action



Professional Misconduct

- Professional misconduct includes the following (partial list):
- Engaging in acts of gross incompetence or gross negligence on a single occasion, or negligence or incompetence on more than one occasion
- Permitting or aiding an unlicensed person to perform activities requiring a license
- Refusing a client or patient service because of race, creed, color, or national origin
- Practicing beyond the scope of the profession
- Releasing confidential information without authorization
- Being convicted of a crime
- Failing to return or provide copies of records on request
- Being sexually or physically abusive
- · Abandoning or neglecting a patient in need of immediate care
- Performing unnecessary work or unauthorized services
- Practicing under the influence of alcohol or other drugs


